

#tenses

PAST PERFECT CONTINUOUS

> it is used to express an action that began before another action in the past, emphasizing its duration

ex. Jean had been waiting for the bus for hours, when it started to rain.

> we usually find it with some **time expressions**: how long, for, since etc.



I/you/he/we/they **had been** + main verb -ing form



I/you/he/we/they **hadn't been** + main verb -ing form



Had I/you/he/we/they **been** + main verb -ing form?

SHORT ANSWER:

Yes, I/you/he/we/they had

No, I/you/he/we/they hadn't

#tenses

PAST PERFECT SIMPLE

>used to express action that happened before a specific action in the past (past simple)

ex. I had met him *before* he become famous → L'ho incontrato prima che diventasse famoso



I/you/he/we/they had (past simple of have to) + main verb past participle



I/you/he/we/they hadn't + main verb past participle



Had I/you/he/we/they + main verb past participle?

SHORT ANSWER :

Yes, I/you/he/we/they had

No, I/you/he/we/they hadn't

>we can find it with some **time expression** like:

- already -earlier
- when -by the time
- just -still
- before -for...years
- it was the first/second time
